Responsibilities

The document entitled *Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Wisteria Park* is a 98-page set of instructions for the on-going fiscal and physical maintenance of Wisteria Park. It was provided to all original homeowners as part of their purchase agreement and can be found on the Argus Management/Wisteria Park Web site at <u>www.argusmgmt.com</u>. It sets out the various responsibilities of the Homeowners Association for the maintenance of common areas and of homeowners for their individual properties and other adjacent areas.

Grounds Maintenance and "Adjacent areas"

For example, did you know that the *Declaration* states that "...each owner shall routinely maintain any sodded or landscaped areas adjacent to his...Lot"? These areas run from lot lines up to the edge(s) of pavement and/or exterior boundaries. In most cases, these adjacent areas are the landscaped strips along the street in which our mail boxes are placed as well as the strips along the back or sides of property next to fences.

Surface Water and Drainage

The surface water management system is an important consideration in Florida and a number of articles in the *Declaration* deal with this issue and prohibit, among other things, the"...excavation of...soil...in such manner as to affect the surface".

A major concern has been the ongoing whitefly infestation that has damaged so many ficus hedges. Ficus in common areas will be pruned and treated shortly. Look for further communication about the protocol the Board has adopted to inform homeowners of the need to treat plants on their property in order to keep Wisteria Park as free as possible from this pest.
