Decision Reached in East Side Landscaping Opt -Out Request

At the July 23, 2018 HOA Board Meeting, nine (9) East Side homeowners requested to "Opt Out" of HOA provided landscaping services. They were not satisfied with the quality of services provided and would like to manage their landscaping themselves. Your HOA Board and interested homeowners have discussed "Opt Out" at seven (7) subsequent HOA Board meetings. At these meetings a document packet was reviewed and updated to capture the information needed to make an informed decision.

In February 2019 a survey was sent to East Side Homeowners to capture their opinion on the Opting Out of landscape Services.

56 of 72 home owners responded to survey.

The results of survey:

Supporting Opting out

Yes 8 No 47 No Response 1

If Opting Out allowed – would you Opt Out?

Yes 2 No 48 No response 6

The East Side Landscaping Committee reviewed the survey results and recommended to the Board with a 4 to 1 vote to to continue with mandatory East Side Landscaping Services.

At the March 25, 2018 the Board reviewed, discussed and voted 3 to 1 (one absent) to continue with Mandatory East Side Landscaping Services. The complete Opt-Out process is located on line on the Sunstate website.

Southeastern Guide Dogs (SEGD) breeds, raises and trains puppies to become life changers for Visually Impaired people and Veterans with disabilities – all funded by public fund raising.

A few years ago, in this Newsletter, we wrote about Meisha Wilson's commitment to raising puppies for SEGD. This year she was joined by Bob Harcourt, Wendy Draina (both recent SEGD volunteers) and Rob Russell to bring Wisteria Park into SEGD's annual Walkathon fundraising campaign. At an informational gathering in February, Andre Essington talked to the group about how his Guide dog – Jacob has enabled him to stay active and independent, and Sandy Canata described her commitment to raising Poe from puppyhood to successful Guide Dog candidate.

Gradually, contribution momentum grew and at present 37 Wisteria Parkers and friends have pitched in \$4,200 to support SEGD operations. As a bonus, a couple more Wisteria Park residents have expressed interest in volunteering to help SEGD with the raising and care of their puppies.
