Year-to-Date Community Improvements

These are the major projects we've been working on in 2023. Our goal is to beautify our surroundings, increase the enjoyment of living here, and optimize the value of our property.





Major pool renovations include pool deck resurfacing, tile repair, canopy repair, building structure repair, parking lot resurfacing, mechanical repairs, and more.

Our monument letters, which had been vandalized numerous times, were ultimately replaced with a cast material instead of the foam we had previously used and newly attached with anchors and epoxy.

Additionally, the complete resurfacing of the perimeter wall on our property was completed. (see before and after below).

Related projects, but not shown here, include the cleanup and restoration of the swale between Wisteria and Mango, the cleanup around the fencing on the west side, and major cosmetic improvements along

Last year, the HOA Board hired an engineering firm to update our Reserve Study. The study is used as a guide for the timing of capital improvement projects in our neighborhood. One of the projects completed from this study is the repair of the exterior stucco wall. The wall was pressure washed, cracks filled and sanded, and repainted to give a fresh look to Wisteria Park. Another big project was the improvements and repairs made to the pool area. The asphalt driveway was given a new surface earlier this year. More recently, the pool deck cracks were repaired, the entire pool deck was repainted, and loose and broken pool tiles were also repaired.

The HOA board will be looking for additional board members at the end of the year. If you are looking for a way to give back to your community, consider becoming part of the HOA Board.
